

## Master of Science (MS) in Clinical Psychology Program Prerequisites

### *Upper division undergraduate courses*

Additional upper division psychology course<sup>a, b</sup>

<sup>a</sup> Must be completed with grade of C or higher.

<sup>b</sup> Must be completed before entry into the MS program.

<sup>c</sup> Must be completed before second year of MS study; lower division course acceptable.

<sup>d</sup> Must be completed by end of second semester of MS study; Must be completed with grade of B- or higher.

As noted above, not all prerequisites must be completed before entry into the program. However, failure to complete all program prerequisites before program entry will likely extend time to graduation.

Be sure to pay close attention to upper and lower division designations. Lower division courses (typically those taken at community colleges or the first two years of undergraduate work at four-year institutions) cannot be substituted for upper division courses, with the exception of PSYC 306. Your current institution can assist in determining whether a course is lower or upper division.
