A New Community: CSUF's Pollak Library South Renovation

Earlier this year, Cal State Fullerton's Pollak Library opened up its doors to the south side, which was under construction following an earthquake many years ago that left damages to the library. The first floor is open to anyone who wishes to find study spaces and connect and network with others. Walking into the newly renovated library, it is clear that the goal of the project was to build and promote a studentcentered space. The front desk invites visitors into a warm atmosphere, and the room welcomes visitors with its bright lighting, colorful furniture, and spacious venue. There are many resources available to students. Titancard services are now available on the south side of the library, as well as an information desk and a circulation desk, where the lost and found is located. The University Honors Program and Center for Scholars have moved into this space, along with the five-campus diversity resource centers (African American RC, Chicana/Chicano RC, Titan Dreamers RC, Asian Pacific American RC, and LGBTQ RC). Having these resources all together creates an active community among us Titans, who not only strive for academic success, but want to provide a welcoming space to cultivate and share ideas among peers. We can simply grab a cup (or two) of coffee from the Starbucks in the lobby to help us study for exams or sit down and socialize with others. No matter what we do, the south side of the library will provide us with such resources to help us succeed.

Professor Spotlight: Russell Espinoza

Dr. Russ Espinoza is a well esteemed and respected figure in the California State University of Fullerton community. He has won numerous awards as both an educator and faculty member. His awards include "Teacher of the Year" and "Faculty of the Year" for the years of 2011, 2012, 2013, 2016, and 2017. He has also won many awards as a member of the Humanities and Social Sciences department.

One of the most interesting awards he has received was for his work in researching bias in the use of the death penalty. It is called the Death Penalty Focus Award. Espinoza's research has proven that low economic status African Americans are subjected to the death penalty significantly more than any other group of individuals. This award ceremony was held where the Golden Globes occur each year in Beverly Hills.

Dr. Espinoza received his Bachelor's degree at California State University, Northridge. He spent his undergraduate years researching Psychology in Law. He also received a Master's degree in Family Therapy from Northridge and did a lot of work as a counselor. He worked in group homes for both children and adults. He also would work with addicts. He pursued his Ph.D. in Psychology in Law at the University of Nebraska.

Dr. Espinoza did not start off wanting to pursue a career in Psychology. At the age of seventeen, he dropped out of college to become a musician in Hollywood. He joined a rock and roll band called "Wretched" and happily toured the world as lead guitarist and songwriter. He felt like he had a decent exposure to psychology because each of his bandmates were either in jail or had a mental illness. He said this led to a natural progression of wanting to study forensic psychology.

One interesting fact about Dr. Espinoza is that he partied with some famous rock bands including "Poison" and "Guns and Roses." His manager was also the manager for "Guns and Roses."

Today Dr. Espinoza happily calls himself an "old Dad." He loves teaching his two-year-old son how to play guitar.

As a final note, Dr. Espinoza says that to be successful in Psychology, you need to work harder than anyone else.

If you are interested in taking one of his classes, he instructs Research Methods, Psychology in Law, Psychology of Prejudice and Discrimination, Social Psychology, Graduate courses in Diversity, and Personality Psychology.
